## About the Trust

The National Trust (NT) is a non-government, community-based organisation dedicated to promoting and conserving the heritage of the Northern Territory.

It was established by an Act of the Legislative Assembly in 1976, and it affiliated with the Australian Council of National Trusts.

Some of the major activities of the National Trust include:

- raising public aware of heritage through events, tours and publications
- lobbying the government about heritage issues
- managing a number of historic properties across the Territory
- maintaining reference libraries and archival materials and register of significant places.

Nineteen historic properties are owned or managed by the National Trust Northern Territory alone. The cost of restoring these places and maintaining them at an appropriate standard is enormous.
